Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life

**Water
Conservation Goal:
Voluntary**

Although the State has allowed us to eliminate mandatory water conservation, they acknowledge drought conditions continue in some parts of the State. As a result, efficient, reasonable water use is to continue to be a way of life for Californians, and certain water use restrictions have been continued indefinitely to eliminate water waste. The permanent water-use restrictions now in effect are:

1. Washing of vehicles, trailers, boats must be with a shutoff nozzle
2. Do not wash paved or hardscaped surfaces
3. Fountains must recirculate water
4. Drinking water served at restaurants only upon request
5. Do not irrigate with potable water between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily
6. Do not irrigate landscaping within 48 hours after measurable rainfall
7. New construction landscaping must be irrigated by drip and micro spray systems
8. Public street medians with ornamental turf may not be irrigated with potable water
9. Hotel guest option of daily linen laundering
