**APPLICATION PACKET FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE  
CONTRA COSTA MOSQUITO & VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

The City of Brentwood is accepting applications from interested residents to represent Brentwood on the Contra Costa Mosquito & Vector Control District Board of Trustees. Applicants must reside within the city limits.

The responsibility of the Board of Trustees, each representing one of the incorporated cities in Contra Costa County or the county at large, is to govern the Mosquito and Vector Control District knowledgeably and effectively. The District is dedicated to the health and welfare of the county's (more than one million) residents, covering 736 square miles. Funded through tax dollars, the District offers free services for the control of mosquitos, rats and mice, ground-nesting yellow jackets, ticks, and skunks.

- The Board of Trustees meets the second Monday evening of every other month at 155 Mason Circle in Concord, CA. Committees meet approximately twice a month or as needed.
- \$100.00 per month is paid to each Trustee, only if they attend a meeting, and regardless of the number of meetings attended.
- Applicants for the Board (representing Brentwood) must reside within the city limits; and be a Contra Costa County taxpayer and at least the voting age of 18; with an interest in any of the following areas: public health, public policy, wetlands, farming, community education, finance, personnel or land development.
- The first term is two years, commencing upon appointment; additional terms would be two to four years.

Your application can be submitted in person at the City Clerk's office located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of City Hall located at 150 City Park Way, or e-mailed to [cityclerk@brentwoodca.gov](mailto:cityclerk@brentwoodca.gov), or via fax to 925.516.5441.
