Background

The City of Brentwood Youth Commission is an advisory body to the City Council, dedicated to promoting the youth voice in local government. Founded in 1999, the Youth Commission is made up of ten students of diverse backgrounds who care about the Brentwood community and have a drive to make our community the best possible place for youth. Youth Commissioners are supported by three adult advisors and City staff. The Youth Commission has organized youth-oriented events such as dances/socials, fundraisers, youth forums, and city events. The Youth Commission offers scholarships to local high school seniors by raising money at various fundraisers.

Benefits of Being an Adult Advisor

Advisors of the Brentwood Youth Commission will experience a unique opportunity to work with students from all Brentwood middle and high schools, as well as city leaders and staff, to implement policies and programs that positively impact the youth of our community. Advisors have the opportunity to share their life experiences with commissioners and help shape the future of Brentwood's youth. Advisors mentor the students as they work with them on subcommittees, special projects and meetings.

Current Openings

The City of Brentwood is currently seeking adults to serve in the capacity of adult advisors for the Youth Commission. Applicants must reside in the city limits of Brentwood and term length is two years, beginning July 2018.

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Application Process

1. Complete this application thoroughly and enclose answers to essay questions. Please only return pages 3 & 4 and keep the informational pages (pages 1 & 2).
2. Only City of Brentwood residents will be considered.
3. All applicants are **strongly encouraged** to attend a Youth Commission meeting to observe how the commission works. All meetings are held at City Council Chamber, 150 City Park Way at 7:00 p.m. Upcoming meeting dates are March 7 and April 4, 2018.
4. Applicants under consideration for a position will be invited to interview. The interview will take place on a selected date, during the week of April 16, 2018, at the Brentwood Community Center, 35 Oak Street. Invitations to interview will be emailed, with available interview times listed.
5. The Youth Commission will notify applicants who have been recommended for appointment. Appointments are not final until the Brentwood City Council has approved and appointed them.
6. Approved appointees will begin their terms as Adult Advisors at the July 2018 regular meeting.

Time Commitments & Responsibilities

1. **General Meetings:** The 1st Wednesday of each month from 7:00–8:15 p.m. (approximately)
2. **Special Committees:** Each Adult Advisor is responsible to serve on a minimum of one special committee each school year. These committees will work on special projects including planning events and/or projects such as the Youth Survey and meet once or twice per month in addition to the regular Youth Commission meetings.
3. **Special Events & Fundraisers:** Adult Advisors are encouraged to actively participate in all special events and fundraisers that the Youth Commission supports or offers. These take place approximately every other month.
4. **General Behavior:** Adult Advisors are expected to maintain a high level of leadership in their role. Advisors represent the City of Brentwood and should behave accordingly.
